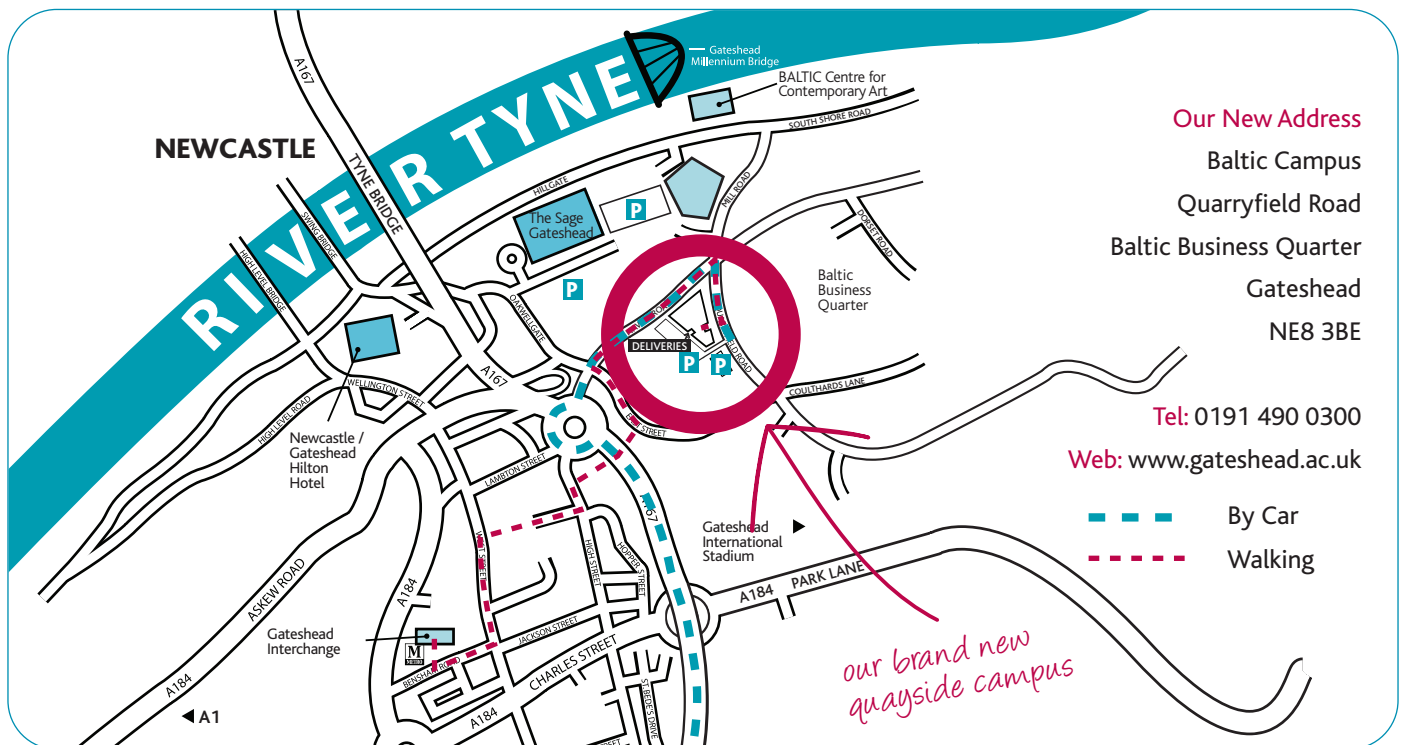


How to get to Gateshead College Baltic Campus

Welcome to your Gateshead College Baltic Campus Travel Guide

Our new campus is easily accessible by all methods of travel. We would encourage you to consider alternatives to car travel which can help keep you and the environment healthy.

Walking

Walking is a healthy form of exercise and generates no pollution. The Baltic Campus site is 10 minutes' walk from Gateshead Interchange (Bus and Metro) and 15 minutes from Central Station (Metro and Rail).

Cycling

Cycling is a great way to keep fit while travelling to work and there is an ever-expanding network of on-road bike lanes and off-road cycle paths.

The Baltic Campus is close to Keelman's Way, which is a nationally recognised cycleway which follows the south side of the River Tyne. Cycle parking is available at the Baltic Campus. Folding cycles are permitted on the Metro and for those with conventional bikes, a number of Metro stations have secure cycle parking. Metro

The Metro provides extensive transport throughout the Tyne and Wear area on a frequent basis. The nearest Metro stations to the Baltic Campus are Gateshead Interchange (10 minutes' walk) and Central Station (15 minutes' walk).

Bus

There are bus stops outside the Baltic Campus for the following services, which link with Gateshead Interchange:

Q1 QuayLink (Stagecoach)

This frequent electric hybrid bus service connects Newcastle Central Station, Monument and Gateshead waterfront and operates every 10 minutes.

93/94 The Loop (Go North East)

The 93/94 Loop links all four Gateshead College campuses: Academy for Sport; Skills Academy for Automotive, Manufacturing, Engineering and Logistic; Skills Adacemy for Construction and the Baltic Campus, as well as Heworth and Gateshead Interchanges.

LinkUp

LinkUp is a bus service that you can book on the phone and is available to everyone in Tyne and Wear. It provides journeys at times when regular services are not operating or where direct services are not available.

Rail

Newcastle Central Station is the regional hub for both long and short distance rail services. The Baltic Campus can be reached by foot (15 minutes' walk), by bus (Q1 QuayLink), Metro and a short walk or taxi ride. There is a Metro station in Central Station.

Motorcycles

Motorcycles and mopeds can be more environmentally friendly than cars and are more space efficient. There is parking for motorcycles at the Baltic Campus.

Taxi

There are taxi ranks at Gateshead Interchange and Newcastle Central Station.

Park And Ride

You can Park & Ride at the following Metro Stations: Callerton Parkway, Bank Foot, Kingston Park, Regent Centre, Heworth, East Boldon, Stadium of Light, Four Lane Ends and Northumberland Park.

We are keen to promote environmentally friendly travel and encourage staff, students and other visitors to use alternative transport to single occupancy car travel. The Baltic Campus is accessible from all major regional roads and is situated just off the A167 - a major connection between Newcastle and Gateshead. Car sharing

Car sharing can help reduce traffic congestion and keep the costs of your journey down. Gateshead College runs a car sharing scheme.
